Relations between Protestants and Catholics are better now than they were five years ago?

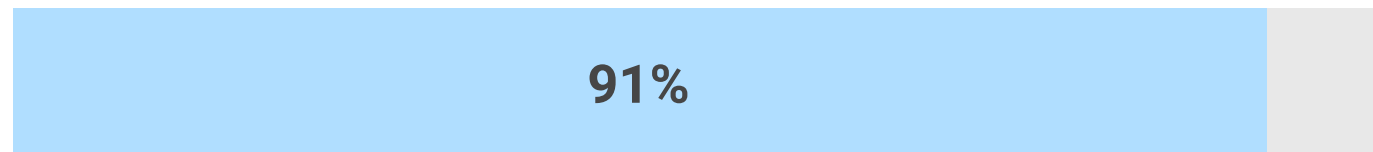

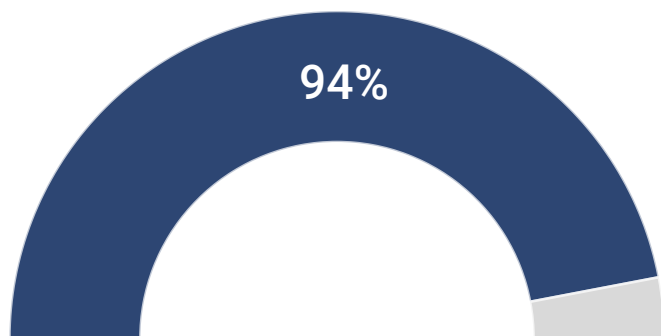

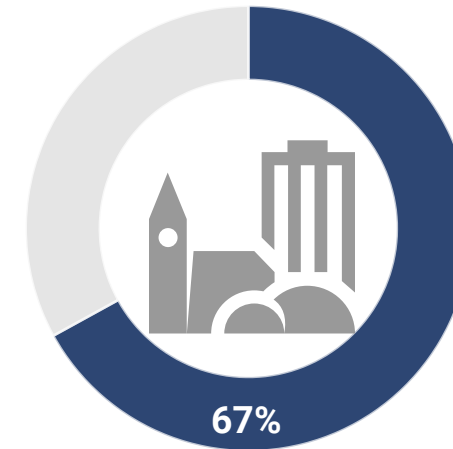

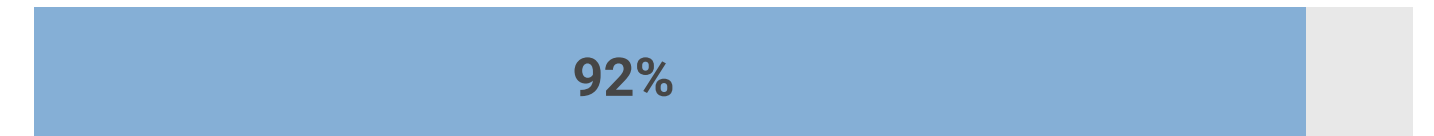

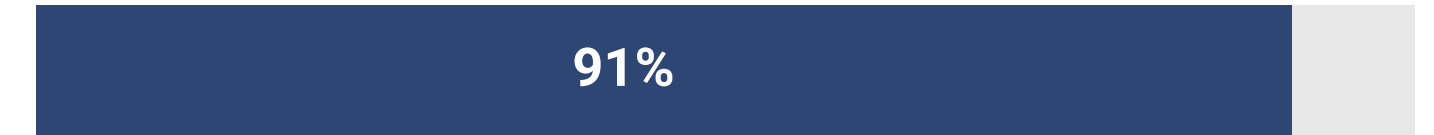


Two thirds of people see town centres as safe and welcoming places for people from all walks of life

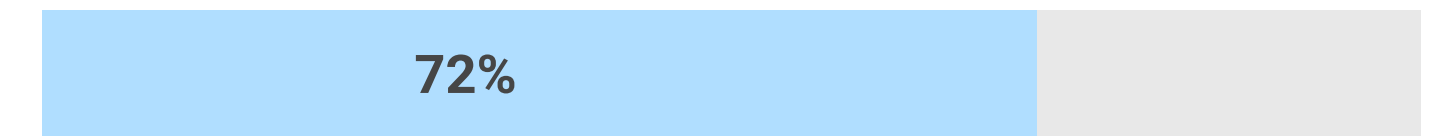

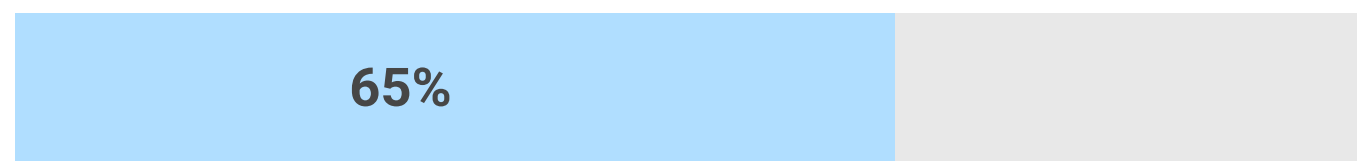

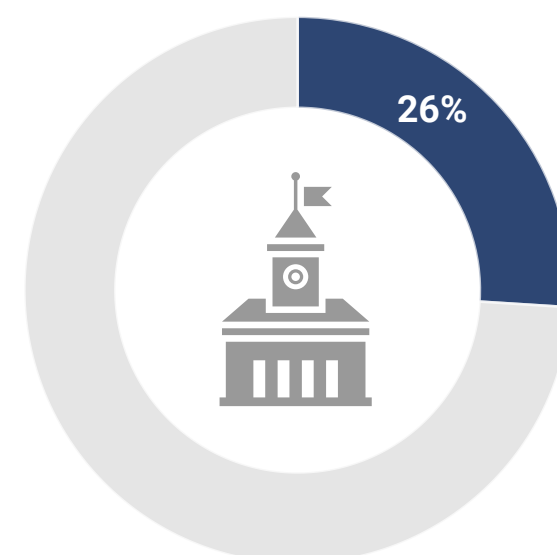
Proportion of adults who think that Protestant Communities add to the richness and diversity of Northern Ireland society



Proportion of adults who think that Catholic Communities add to the richness and diversity of Northern Ireland society

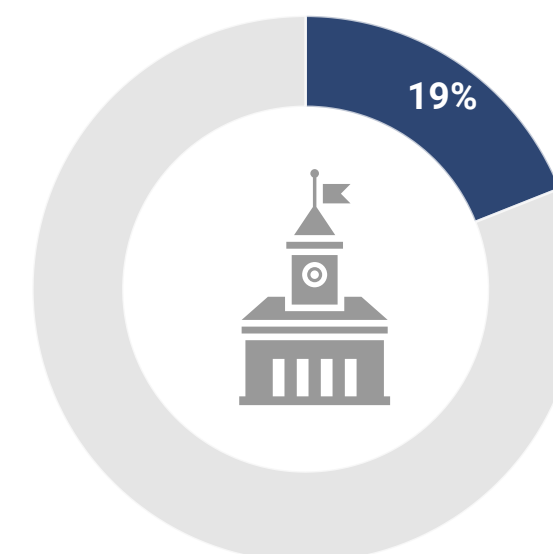
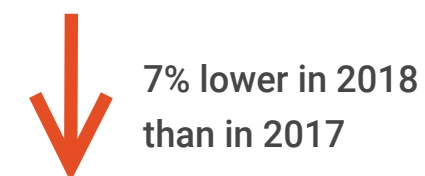


Proportion of adults who think that Minority Ethnic Communities add to the richness and diversity of Northern Ireland society

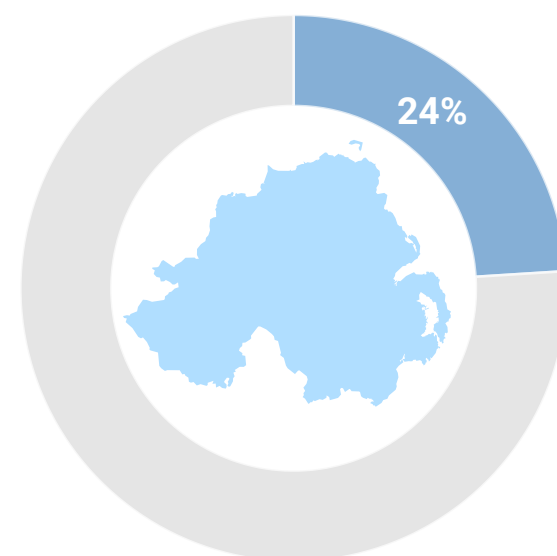

Proportion of adults who feel they have an influence on local decisions

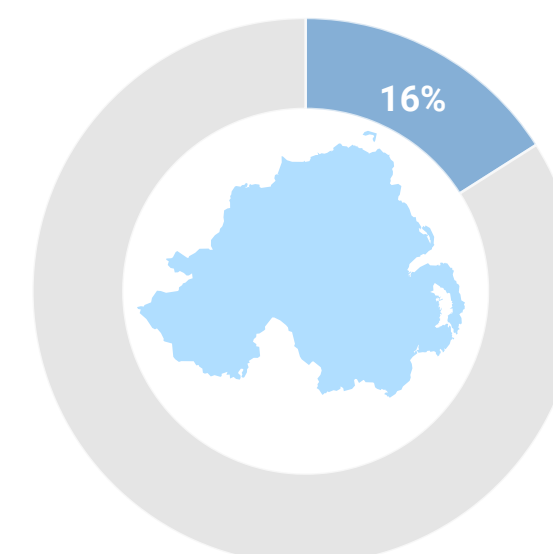
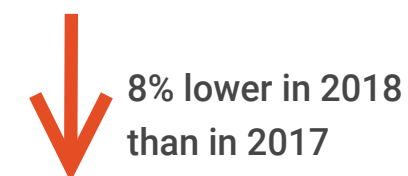
